
Architect Peter Bohlin and his team at Bohlin Cywinski Jackson have accepted the charge to design the entry pavilion within Hermann Park's newest treasure, the Centennial Gardens.

Peter is well known for his wide range of work, including the retail stores for Apple worldwide, public institutions such as the new Newport Beach City Hall, and cultural buildings including the Discovery and Visitor Center in Grand Teton National Park.

This fall, he will bring his internationally renowned talent to Hermann Park's Centennial Gardens project. As the Conservancy's largest and lushest undertaking to date, the Centennial Gardens will honor and celebrate 100 years of Hermann Park, which will reach this milestone year in 2014.

In 2010, the American Institute of Architects awarded Peter its Gold Medal, the highest achievement bestowed upon an individual architect by the Institute. His ability to augment the experience of one's surroundings through architecture makes him an exciting choice and ideal fit to design the signature structure situated in eight acres of breathtaking gardens. Though the project is of a relatively modest scope in comparison to most of his commissions, Peter understood the importance of the Park's centennial and its place in Houston's history and personally wanted to be involved. To have someone of his caliber involved in this project is exciting for Hermann Park and the city. To see examples of his work and plans for the entry pavilion, turn to pages 6 and 7.

Thanks to co-sponsors Hermann Park Conservancy and the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, the public will have an opportunity to learn more about Peter Bohlin at a lecture and discussion with the architect on Thursday, October 25 at 6:30pm. ## Shortly after the turn of the last century, an exciting evolution was taking place in Houston.

Developments in transportation, culture, arts, and education were emerging to attract newcomers and serve the growing population. The Port of Houston, the Houston Symphony, Hermann Park, and other places and institutions are now approaching their 100th birthdays. At the 2012 Evening in the Park gala, the Conservancy was pleased to honor Rice University, celebrating its centennial this year. With Rice's establishment in 1912 and the Park's following in 1914, the two neighbors share a longstanding history. Mayor Parker, Phoebe Tudor, and Rice president David Leebron had a humorous perspective on this shared history.

The Conservancy has recently begun building partnerships with other members of the community to celebrate Hermann Park's centennial in 2014. We are working with arts and cultural organizations, community groups, universities, and others to help us spread awareness about the occasion and say "Happy Birthday, Hermann Park" through their own programs and special events.

So far, a number of organizations are partnering with the Conservancy to accomplish this goal. *Houston History* magazine recently featured Hermann Park in its summer issue. We are grateful to the magazine for showcasing Houston's signature park and its centennial. The Museum of Fine Arts, Houston is co-sponsoring a lecture and discussion with Peter Bohlin, the architect designing the Centennial Gardens pavilion. There are many others also committed to helping celebrate the centennial. Please see a list of the organizations partnering with us on page 10.

Together, we will ensure that Hermann Park's 100th birthday is truly a citywide celebration!

## Pavilion at the Centennial Gardens

The Centennial Gardens project will transform Hermann Park's Garden Center into a premier destination for Houstonians and tourists. Eight acres of various gardens, from a sweet-smelling formal rose garden to a winding woodland garden of tall trees and understory plants, will inspire visitors of all ages and invigorate the senses. To begin the journey, visitors will first pass through a signature structure, the pavilion designed by world-renowned architect Peter Bohlin.

The pavilion will welcome visitors who come to explore the gardens as well as provide accommodations for meetings and special events thanks to interior space and an outdoor courtyard with seating. The building will be designed to bring the outside in, connecting those sitting inside with the lush scenery just beyond the glass walls.

Peter is well known for designing private homes, retail spaces, and public buildings that accomplish this relationship with natural surroundings. These projects, which vary in scale and situation, are designed with special attention to their function and physical setting. Bohlin Cywinski Jackson has received more than 510 regional, national, and international awards for design. Here are some examples of their celebrated work and an initial sketch of his design for the Centennial Garden pavilion.

# Birding in Hermann Park

Did you know that Hermann Park is a prime spot for bird watching? The Park is home to or visited by many species of birds and waterfowl. On any day while strolling around McGovern Lake, visitors are greeted by the cute little black and white American Coots, the orange beaked Black-bellied Whistling Ducks, Ring-necked Ducks, Mallards, and if they are lucky, the occasional colorful Wood Duck.

Since Hermann Park is located on the Central Migratory Flyway, many species of birds can be seen flying overhead, resting on the bird islands in the middle of the lake, or feeding on berries of native plants. Through a partnership with the Houston Audubon Society, a dedicated group of birders visits the Park monthly to survey and photograph the many species that can be found in Houston's very own backyard. Learn about the Hermann Park bird count at **www.houstonaudubon.org**.

Some of the species spotted include cormorants diving for fish in the lake, herons surveying the offerings in the Japanese Garden ponds, woodpeckers scavenging tree trunks for tasty morsels, elusive Red-Tailed Hawks on the hunt, as well as the more common swallows, wrens, grackles, starlings, and mockingbirds. These are only a sampling of the various feathered visitors to the Park, so grab your binoculars and come on a still early morning and see what you can find!
