Summertime in the McGovern Centennial Gardens



Vibrant blooms, cheerful birdsong, and the soothing sound of cascading water make the McGovern Centennial Gardens a perfect spot for a summertime escape. As the gardens begin their second summer in Hermann Park, roses and wisteria vines continue to climb trellises to create scenic archways as new plants are being introduced.

A new feature for visitors to the McGovern Centennial Gardens' Family Garden will be a beehive. Brought to us by William Sikkema, a graduate student in the Chemistry Department at Rice University, the resident bees will be a wonderful addition to a garden full of pollinator-plants. The Flow Hive is a new technology that will allow honey to be drained directly into a container. From the hive, the bees will pass through a clear tube and then fly above the Family Garden, avoiding most human contact.

New fruit trees have been added in the Family Garden including avocado and Cherry of the Rio Grande; blackberry and blueberry bushes; and a wide variety of flowers that attract pollinators and other beneficial insects. Butterflies and birds are drawn to plants and water features throughout the McGovern Centennial Gardens creating great opportunities for birdwatchers and photographers. Red-shouldered hawks, screech owls, warblers, blue jays and a variety of other birds have been spotted in the Gardens.

at Evening in the Park



This year, it was our privilege to honor a long-time friend of Hermann Park Conservancy, Linda Hunsaker, whose love for Hermann Park dates back to her childhood. She has been a member of the executive committee for eight of her ten years on the Conservancy board and has served on the visitor services and board engagement committees. Linda worked behind the scenes to help make our centennial-year Evening in the Park gala a magical night and served as co-chair of the Centennial Events fundraising committee.

Linda has a special place in her heart for children, helping to raise the funds needed to build a playground in Hermann Park. She founded the local non-profit, B-E-A-R (Be a Resource), improving the lives of children in the CPS system.

We appreciate the time and knowledge that Linda has shared with the Conservancy, but most of all, we appreciate her kindness. Whether she's delivering food to the office when she knows that we can't get out for lunch or loaning a special hat to a staff member for Hats in the Park, Linda is a good friend to us and to our community.

Although I could never get her to wear a hat, Sara Houstoun Lindsey also loved spring in Hermann Park. We lost an extraordinary friend on February 16, 2016 when she passed away. Sara had a strong sense of duty to improve her community, and spent a lifetime making Houston a more beautiful place. She and John, her husband of nearly 70 years, gave a gift to Hermann Park Conservancy to finish the remarkable transformation of the Heart of the Park at a time when there was very little private investment in public parks. The Sara H. and John H. Lindsey Plaza serves as a tribute to their generosity.

Sara's connection to Hermann Park goes back decades. She once described a scavenger hunt in high school in which students were asked to find watermelon seeds (during the winter). Sara and John had the smart idea to check for seeds in Hermann Park. They searched under picnic tables with a flashlight that night, found the seeds, and won the contest. Sara's love for Hermann Park continued throughout her life. While the world is a little less fun with the loss of Sara, her life has left a legacy of beauty. The Heart of the Park reflects her expansive spirit and warm heart.

The Conservancy Plans for the Park's Future

The award-winning landscape architecture firm, Michael Van Valkenburgh Associates (MVVA), is creating an updated master plan for Hermann Park which will guide improvements in the Park for the next 20 years. MVVA specializes in planning and designing landscapes that enrich urban areas and engage the imagination. The firm's projects include the creation of Brooklyn Bridge Park, the renovation of Maggie Daley Park in Chicago, and the landscaping of the grounds of the George W. Bush Presidential Center in Dallas.

Over the next year, the MVVA team will analyze data, meet with community members and develop preliminary concepts. The Conservancy has identified underutilized areas of the Park, particularly on its edges, including Bayou Parkland and the corner of Fannin and Cambridge Streets, and is considering development plans for these areas to further improve the Park and access to it for millions of visitors each year.

MVVA planners, led by Matt Urbanski and Chris Matthews, recently spent time in the Park in an effort to understand the needs of visitors and partners which operate in and around the Park, especially on busy days. An important goal of the updated master plan is to find sustainable solutions for parking and traffic management while enhancing pedestrian, bike and METRORail access. The Conservancy is thrilled to work with MVVA on this important project.

Local Teens Help Kick-off Let's Move! Outside Program in Houston

Houston has been selected as one of 50 cities nationwide to participate in the U.S. Department of the Interior's Let's Move! Outside program, part of Michelle Obama's initiative to inspire young people to play, learn, serve and work outdoors. It also encourages kids to take advantage of the public lands available to them and to become future stewards of the land. The program is funded through a \$5 million national commitment by the American Express Foundation and will be facilitated by the YMCA of Greater Houston.

At a press conference in Hermann Park's McGovern Centennial Gardens on April 7, 2016, Mayor Sylvester Turner, Congressman Al Green, Assistant Secretary for Land

and Minerals Management of the U.S. Department of the Interior, Janice Schneider, and the president and CEO of the YMCA of Greater Houston, Paul McIntire, introduced the program with the help of area teens. Following the conference, the officials joined the students for a service project in the Family Garden.

Houston was chosen, according to Schneider, because of its commitment to parks and green spaces. "Houston is blessed with amazing public parks and a strong network of public and nonprofit leaders committed to getting kids outdoors, active and connected to nature," she said.

Longleaf Pine

Pinus palustris, or the Longleaf
Pine, shapes the character of the
Piney Woods of east Texas and
northern Louisiana. Even early
designs for McGovern Centennial
Gardens included an east Texas
garden that captured the character
of a native pine forest underlain
by ferns and palmettos. When you
walk the Tudor Family Pine Hill
Walk, you will see predominantly
Loblolly Pines (Pinus taeda) in larger
sizes, with medium and quite small
Longleaf Pine scattered throughout.

Longleaf Pine is easily recognizable for the length of its needles, 10-15" long held in bundles of three. These trees prefer deep sandy soils, and can grow to heights of 125'. The wood of the Longleaf Pine, also known as Yellow Pine, Georgia Pine, and Heart Pine, is useful in many applications due to its strength and durability. The seeds are eaten by as many as 10 species of birds and by many rodents.



The weather was perfect on Valentine's night for nearly 40 couples dining on Pinewood Cafe's scenic terrace overlooking McGovern Lake. The Conservancy's third annual "Dinner and a Cruise" brought new and returning guests to enjoy a meal including an appetizer sampler, choice of entrée, and a dessert. Each couple was given a pair of train tickets and a carnation. After dinner, sweethearts rode pedal boats around McGovern Lake amid colorful reflections of city lights cast on the lake.

The Cultural Landscape Foundation Conference Comes to Houston

Jane Curtis, the Conservancy's director of horticulture, led a tour in Hermann Park on March 12, 2016 as part of a conference presented by the Cultural Landscape Foundation (TCLF), based in Washington D.C. The non-profit organization is focused on raising awareness of historical landscapes through tours, conferences and books. The event brought landscape architects and design professionals from across the country. Curtis and Matt Urbanski of Michael Van Valkenburgh Associates, the firm designing an update the Park's master plan, were panelists for a discussion of the evolution of Houston's public spaces.

The session kicked off with a review of the significance of Hermann Park and its master plan as the catalyst for major improvement projects. Jane discussed the Park's 100-year



history and its early planners as well as the master plan designed in the 1990s to bring many of the original plans to completion. The Houston conference highlighted the landscape architecture that is transforming our city at a scale not seen in the U.S. in a century. TCLF also published a guide, What's Out There Houston, to draw attention to significant landscapes in the city. An online version is available on their website: tclf.org.
